6	1	Geography	Lewis Miller "caught" these fishermen with "Large" catfish on the New River near Pepper's Ferry in this mid-nineteenth century sketch.
58	5	Civil War	Slave trader taking slaves from Staunton to Tennessee.
58	5	Civil War	Slaves being sold in Christiansburg
61	5	Civil War	John Craig, Jr., Christiansburg, killed at Chancellorsville, 3 May 1863, memorialized in a Lewis Miller sketch.
65	5	Civil War	The construction of the Virginia and Tennessee Railroad, an 1853 Lewis Miller sketch.
80	5	Civil War	Ingles Bridge over the New River as sketched by Lewis Miller in 1859. The Ingles Bridge was burned by Col. John McCausland's troops to slow down the Union forces advance to the New River Railroad Bridge at Present-day Radford in May 1864.
131	6	County Gov.	The old county office building as sketched by Lewis Miller, August 12, 1856
131	6	County Gov.	The Montgomery County Courthouse in the center of the town square in Christiansburg in an 1831 Lewis Milleer sketch.
147	7	Lewis Miller	A daguerreotype showing Lewis Miller during his middle years, circa 1859.
149	7	Lewis Miller	"Every day's observation," a sketch, is captioned "Timber for Shingle's [sic] to cover houses, Montgomery County."
151	7	Lewis Miller	Lewis Miller 1856 sketch of the "East view" of Christiansburg shows houses lining East Main Street.
152	7	Lewis Miller	May 15, 1856, sketch of the "Female Academy" notes that the school's teachers were Miss and Mrs. Henriques and Mr. Bartley.
153	7	Lewis Miller	Letter to Lewis Miller from Samuel Small of York, Pennsylvania, written March 24, 1881, transmitting a check for fifteen dollars.
154	7	Lewis Miller	"Bank House in Christiansburg" sketch bears the caption: "Go Search in the city and through palace halls mongst the wealthy, and proud, and gay; their beauty is much like the morning flower that wilts in a Single day."
155	7	Lewis Miller	The Charles Miller house, sketched by Lewis Miller shortly after its construction in 1856, still stands on South Franklin Street in Christiansburg.
157	7	Lewis Miller	The rowdy pair at the right foreground in Miller's sketch of the Temperance Hall in Christiansburg illustrates his wry sense of humor.
159	7	Lewis Miller	The Ingles Farm, a large farm complex on the New River, is recorded in this undated Miller sketch.
161	7	Lewis Miller	In this highly detailed sketch, Lewis Miller shows the view looking northwest at the "Mrs. Widow Wade House and Mill" near Christiansburg.
162	7	Lewis Miller	Miller created the intrically folded and decorated valentine in 1857.
183	8	Transportation	Ingles Bridge over the New River as sketched by Lewis Miller in 1859.
208	9	Agriculture	"Mr. Etzler's Residence," an 1870 Lewis Miller sketch, showing a typical Montgomery County farm with several outbuildings including a detached kitchen.
249	10	Development	Lewis Miller sketched Christiansburg from a hill northwest of the town square during the mid-nineteenth century.
